# **Reflection: Challenging Times** by Mike Barker

We've heard it said, from many sources, that we are living in challenging times. While this is no doubt true for all of us during the COVID-19 pandemic, we can imagine (or maybe know first-hand), what it must be like for our children having to continue their education outside the classroom. Because of being homebound, there must be times when distractions interrupt the learning process, leading to frustration for everyone involved.

Other challenges have also arisen as a result of this virus we've declared war on. Some have lost jobs; and because businesses that were deemed "non-essential" have closed, some have done so for good. While we cannot underestimate the impact of the foregoing statements, those who've been hospitalized or have died from the virus have encountered it in a way that we who've been spared have not. Still, in one way or another, we've all seen the effects of COVID-19.

To put it in another perspective, this is not the first time that our nation has faced a worldwide pandemic. One that we are all far removed from, but affected my mother at age 7, was the influenza pandemic of 1918. I remember her telling me what they did to treat the disease and help arrest its spread. Some of those measures were the same then as we're using now, but more importantly, it took everyone doing their part, working together as a team to bring the flu under control.

Perhaps there is another perspective for those of us living by the faith that binds us together in love. While we cannot meet together as we most often do, we can remind ourselves of the saints long ago who were scattered abroad and unable to come together because of persecution. While this wasn't due to a pandemic, Acts 8 tells us that our brothers and sisters were scattered abroad throughout Judea and Samaria, leaving only the apostles in Jerusalem. Adding to the persecution was Saul, taking Christians and putting them in prison, doing so with a clear conscience. While their lives were upended, they "went everywhere preaching the good news." The occasion became serendipitous for these Christians; that is, they turned the opposition into an opportunity for good. In his book, "The Spreading Flame," F.F Bruce reminds us that the persecution of Acts 8 "kindled the fire" that led to widespread evangelism in the New Testament world.

Who knows but what we, like those mentioned in Acts 8, now have a great opportunity to turn this into an occasion for good as never before; to strengthen our faith and equip ourselves to be carriers of the word no matter how our lives are impacted by COVID-19. While we haven't been thrown into prison or had to leave homesteads out of fear for our lives, we have been "inconvenienced" by being housebound. Rather than being bored with "time on our hands," we can redeem the time to study, to reflect, and contemplate how we can be used as God's servants. Hopefully, when we are able to meet again, we will do so with great fervor, and with a willingness to let God direct our efforts, using the outcome for His purpose.
