Reflection: Psalm 139 by Mike Barker

Psalm 139 is truly remarkable in many ways. It not only gives praise and adoration for God's unconditional love and watchfulness, it further reveals that he knows our every thought, our fears, and our innermost feelings. Christian artist, Rebecca St. James, composed a song based on this psalm with a moving musical arrangement and thoughtful lyrics. From Psalm 139 she writes:

"You search me, you know me, you see my every move.

There's nothing I could ever do to hide myself from you.

You know my thoughts, my fears and hurts, my weaknesses and my pride.

You know what I am going through, and how I feel inside.

But even though you know, you will always love me. Even though you know, you'll never let me go. I don't deserve your love, but you give it freely. You will always love me, even though you know."

If you are not familiar with this song, I encourage you to find it on YouTube or Spotify. You will not be disappointed!

There is yet another thought penned in this psalm whereby David praises God. Cited in verse 14, the man after God's own heart exclaims: "I praise you for I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

While this same verse goes on to praise God for his wonderful works, let's spend some time with this particular thought. We are *"fearfully and wonderfully made"* most certainly for no other reason than we are created in the image of God. "God is spirit," as John 4:24 says. Our spirit, even as it dwells in flesh, makes us akin to God. Yet, when we examine the complexity of our physical body, we can marvel, along with David, at the wonder in which we are made.

There is one aspect of our body we'll use that illustrates this very well; that is the ability to move our fingers quickly and freely without a second thought. We do so through a complex chemical process that causes muscular contraction. The process is so complex that it cannot be mechanically replicated with the same efficiency as that of our bodies. Even when using the most sophisticated laboratory equipment, the components of this reaction break down very slowly. Yet, it occurs inside our body in the blink of an eye as we use our hands many times throughout the day. While David may not have understood the complex chemistry that causes muscular contraction, he penned it well when he wrote, *"I am fearfully and wonderfully made."*

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow," for he not only knows our every thought and feeling, but we are "fearfully and wonderfully made" in His image.
