Reflection: Walking with God – Rory L. Irwin

Recently, Jim Friederichsen sent out an encouraging note by email. In it he mentioned that he awoke one morning thinking about the song "My God and I." The verse he quoted got me thinking, "What does it mean to walk with God today?"

In the military, I spend quite a bit of time walking with other soldiers. It normally involves carrying over 50 pounds of gear and moving at a high rate of speed. After the first few miles, it is hard to focus on anything but putting one foot in front of the other. Although common hardships can bring people together, they only bring us closer to God when we focus on Him during the hardship.

Shelley and I have had opportunities to go for walks in some of the most amazing places. During our walks, we have seen gardens in Kauai, glaciers in Alaska, lighthouses on Lake Michigan, and the mountains in Colorado. Without a doubt, being there with her made the journey all the better because I experienced it with someone I love, and who I know loves me. I believe this is close to what the Bible means when it describes walking with God.

The scriptures give us several instances where men walked with God. "Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him" (Genesis 5:24). What a thought, God loving you so much that He brings you home to be with Him forever! When I consider that Enoch lived shortly before Noah, I must wonder if God took him up because of the plans He had for Noah. And speaking of Noah, he was also a man that "walked with God."

"This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God." (Genesis 6:9)

The Bible does not indicate Noah "physically" walked with God, but we see he walked *faithfully* with God by how he lived for God during hardship. God told Noah to build an ark, so he built one. God told Noah to make the ark a specific size, so he built it exactly as God described. God told Noah to bring animals into the ark, and he did.

We learn a lot from Noah's walk with God. Even in the hardship we are currently experiencing with Covid-19, God offers us an opportunity to walk with Him. Much like Noah, walking with God today involves having a closeness with Him and an intimate trust in Him. God is simply asking us to focus on Him during our walk, and He will be with us.

I'm thankful for Jim's encouraging words that helped me focus on our loving Father and not worry so much about what is happening in the world. I pray my words will also help you focus more on God and less on what is happening in the world around you.
