<u>Reflection</u> – The Faith to Persevere from My Utmost for His Highest Updated Edition

"Because you have kept My command to persevere..." Revelation 3:10

Perseverance means more than endurance – more than simply holding on until the end. A saint's life is in the hands of God like a bow and arrow in the hands of an archer. God is aiming at something the saint cannot see, but our Lord continues to stretch and strain, and every once in a while, the saint says, "I can't take it anymore." Yet God pays no attention; He goes on stretching until His purpose is in sight, and then He lets the arrow fly. Entrust yourself to God's hands. Is there something in your life for which you need perseverance right now? Maintain your intimate relationship with Jesus Christ through the perseverance of faith. Proclaim as Job did, *"Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him"* (Job 13:15).

Faith is not some weak and pitiful emotion, but is strong and vigorous confidence built on the fact that God is holy love. And even though you cannot see Him right now and cannot understand what He is doing, you know Him. Disaster occurs in your life when you lack the mental composure that comes from establishing yourself on the eternal truth that God is holy love. Faith is the supreme effort of your life – throwing yourself with abandon and total confidence upon God.

God ventured His all in Jesus Christ to save us, and now He wants us to venture our all with total abandoned confidence in Him. There are areas in our lives where that faith has not worked in us as yet – places still untouched by the life of God. There were none of those places in Jesus Christ's life, and there are to be none in ours. Jesus prayed, *"This is eternal life, that they may know You…"* (John 17:3). The real meaning of eternal life is a life that can face anything it has to face without wavering. If we will take this view, life will become one great romance – a glorious opportunity of seeing wonderful things all the time. God is disciplining us to get us into this central place of power.

From the Elders regarding delay in returning to worship:

Dear Greenbank Family,

The "headline" this morning is that we have decided to postpone our coming to worship together in the building until a date **later than** <u>July 5</u>...a date that was recently announced.

This decision was made in our overarching concern for the health and safety of the congregation in the face of the unrelenting coronavirus, as we continued to monitor its recent resurgence, some reported negative impacts of other churches across the U.S. and the world who resumed congregational worship in today's environment, etc., as well as expressions of concern by a number of you.

There is no joy in this decision. We simply believe it is the prudent action at this time.

So, what is the plan going forward?

1. On July 5 we will continue to worship online as we have been doing since mid-March, i.e., Brother Domingo will lead us in worship online from his home. **There will be no service at the building on July 5.**

2. On July 12, and into the foreseeable future, we will continue to worship online (no congregational gathering) but the streaming of the worship will originate from the building and Domingo will be joined from time to time by other members of the congregation to lead various segments of the worship. We see this move--as we pray you do-- as a tangible step to transition us toward eventual "normalcy" of our all being together... and that <u>will</u> happen.

3. We will, as we have done, continue to monitor/assess the virus matter with a view to resuming a full coming together as soon as we can do that in confidence. Along the way, we will--as we ask you to--seek wisdom and guidance from our God.

4. We will do our best to keep everyone fully informed and, as always, we covet your thoughts and ideas. To be sure, if any of this is unclear, please ask.

Finally, if any of you are aware of folks who do not have access to email, would you please phone them and let them know of this new plan.

For now, we encourage you --with our full being-- to be strong in the faith, true to your worship and honor to the Father, and supportive of one another.
