Reflection: Spiritual PPE by C. C. Allen

"Stand firm then with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes with the gospel of peace... Take up the shield of faith with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God." Ephesians 6:13-17

Just as the use of herbicides and pesticides require the use of Personal Protective Equipment to protect a farmer from potential harm, Christians need a type of spiritual PPE to protect themselves from the devil. In the Bible, the apostle Paul calls our protection "spiritual armor," and he uses the Roman soldier's armor as an example.

The belt of a Roman soldier was the foundation for the rest of his armor. We put on our "belt of truth" remembering that Jesus Christ is our Truth. Jesus called Satan "the father of lies." Jesus, himself, is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life." The beginning of victory in spiritual warfare is knowing the Truth.

The breastplate guarded the heart of the soldier. The *"breastplate of righteousness"* is not something we put on ourselves. We are righteous not of our own doing but through the blood and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. This righteousness protects the spiritual life of all believers.

Our "feet being fitted by the gospel of peace" is a reminder from Paul about the Roman soldier's sandals. They had big cleats on the underside that helped them stay on their feet during a battle and not lose their ground. Our peace with God helps us stand firm, knowing God will never leave or forsake us.

The helmet protected the soldier's brain. If you've ever heard the phrase, "the battle starts in the mind," this is certainly Satan's agenda. Our "helmet of salvation" is the assurance against doubts the enemy may put in our minds during his attacks.

Last, we need the "sword of the Spirit" which is our only offensive weapon against the devil. That sword is the very Word of God – the Bible. This one weapon requires dedicated reading and memorization on the believer's part.

With your armor on, may you stand firm against the enemy this week.
