<u>Reflection</u> – Life Lessons from Judas Iscariot by Rory Irwin

I must admit, I have a hard time with the story of Judas. It's hard for me to understand why Jesus chose him. It is difficult to understand why someone that lived with Jesus, and saw His ministry up close and personal, would betray Him. The following points tell what I know about Judas and the type of man he was.

- 1) Judas was a thief: John 12:6 "He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the moneybag, he used to help himself to what was put into it."
- 2) Satan entered Judas: John 13:27 "As soon as Judas took the bread, Satan entered him. So, Jesus told him, 'What you are about to do, do quickly.'"
- 3) Judas betrayed Jesus: Matthew 26:48 "Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them; 'The one I kiss is the man; arrest him.'"

I always felt I had to despise Judas, but Jesus called Judas "friend" and accepted him into his inner circle. Then Judas betrayed Him with a kiss. What kind of person would do that? The reality is, I am that kind of person. So, if I despise Judas, logically, I must despise myself. Honestly, Judas and I are the same, we are both sinners. "If we claim to be without sin, we deceived ourselves and the truth is not in us" (John 1:8). What I have come to understand is that Judas, like any of us, was a sinner, and like many of us sometimes we have a hard time believing God can and will forgive us of our sins.

After studying more about Judas, I am reminded that Judas also:

- 1) ... was an apostle (Matthew 10:4)
- 2) ... preached the coming kingdom to Israel (Matthew 10:5-7)
- 3) ... regretted betraying an innocent person (Matthew 27:3-4) "Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, saying, 'I have sinned in that I have betrayed innocent blood.""

Yes, Judas was a sinner, but he was not unredeemable. That is what Judas' death teaches me. I am a sinner, but God's grace is sufficient to remove my sin if I am willing to ask Him for forgiveness.

Colossians 1:21-22 "Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now He has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in His sight, without blemish and **free from accusation**."

I encourage all of us to remember that it was Judas who would not allow himself to be reconciled with God. Jesus loved Judas and died on the cross for him just as much as He died for you and for me. Where I differ from Judas is that I believe with my whole heart that God forgives me. I do not have a life without God in it. Yes, I am still a sinner, but God has bought and redeemed me with the blood of Christ.
