Reflection: Psalm 92 – A Song for the Sabbath by Mike Barker

Many of the Old Testament psalms give laudable praise to God for His majesty and power. Some praise Him for the mighty works that demonstrated this mighty power in a supernatural way. Psalm 92 is one of them! It is called a song for the Sabbath and is addressed to Israel to remind them of those events that happened many years before they lived. It not only gives praise for God's mighty works, it reminds all of us to be thankful for His unfailing love, and for the depth of his thoughts that are far above ours. God's mighty works, his unfailing love, and his majestic thoughts fit together, exhorting all of us to shout His praise continuously and, for Israel, to make music with the harp and lyre.

In addition to these foregoing reminders, there are distinct images from plant life that underscore a different message: that of evil doers who perpetrate evil in contrast to the righteous who do what is good. It often seems that those whose intent is on evil will prosper, and their influence spreads to affect others. The psalmist describes them as "sprouting weeds," a fitting description indeed. However, the writer also witnessed evil doers who were destroyed by their wickedness, their own deeds bringing about their destruction. If they escaped immediate destruction, it would come in a timely manner at God's doing! In contrast to evil doers, those who do good and seek God's way will flourish like palm trees and rise to be strong as the cedars of Lebanon, images suggesting great strength and enduring purpose.

Palm trees have often flourished in the dry, arid desert, and signal that an oasis is nearby. Their roots grow deep in the soil to find underground aquifers that supply the water needed to thrive. They tell the weary traveler that water is there where they can quench their thirst and water their animals. The cedars of Lebanon is a hearty, robust species that will grow to great heights and live for many years. It is known for its great strength and durability, and often provides suitable material to make household furniture and cooking utensils. The godly stand in a stately manner just like the palm and cedar trees to proclaim that the Lord is upright, his support is firm, and there is no wickedness in Him.

The first verse says it well: "It is good to praise the Lord and make music to your name, O Most High." Let us, like the stately palm and cedars of Lebanon trees, stand firm with resolute strength and enduring purpose as we shout praise to His high and holy name.
