Reflection: Bethlehem's Supernatural Star by John Piper (edited)

"Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." (Matthew 2:2)

Over and over the Bible baffles our curiosity about just how certain things happened. How did this "star" get the magi from the east to Jerusalem?

It does not say that it led them or went before them on the way to Jerusalem. It only says they saw a star in the east (Matthew 2:2) and came to Jerusalem. And how did that star go before them in the little fivemile walk from Jerusalem to Bethlehem as Matthew 2:9 says it did? And how did a star "rest over the place where the child was"?

The answer is: We do not know. There are numerous efforts to explain it in terms of conjunctions of planets or comets or supernovas or miraculous lights. We just don't know. And I want to exhort you not to become preoccupied — not to become fixated — on theories that are only tentative in the end and have very little spiritual significance.

I risk a generalization to warn you: People who are exercised and preoccupied with such things, as how the star worked and how the Red Sea split and how the manna fell and how Jonah survived the fish and how the moon turns to blood, are generally people who have what I call a mentality for the marginal.

You do not see in them a deep cherishing of the great central things of the gospel: the holiness of God, the ugliness of sin, the helplessness of man, the death of Christ, the sanctifying work of the Spirit, the glory of Christ's return, and the final judgment. They always seem to be taking you down a sidetrack with some new article or book that they're all excited about dealing with something marginal. There is little rejoicing over the great, central realities.

But what is plain concerning this matter of the star is that it is doing something that it cannot do on its own: It is guiding magi to the Son of God to worship him.

There is only one Person in biblical thinking that can be behind that intentionality in the stars: God himself.

So, the lesson is plain: God is guiding foreigners to Christ to worship him. And he is doing it by exerting global — probably even universal — influence and power to get it done.

Luke shows God influencing the entire Roman Empire so that the census comes at the exact time to get an insignificant virgin to Bethlehem to fulfill prophecy with her delivery. Matthew shows God influencing the stars in the sky to get a little handful of foreigners to Bethlehem so that they can worship the Son.

This is God's design. He did it then. He is still doing it now. His aim is that the nations — all the nations (Matthew 24:14) — worship his Son.

This is God's will for everybody in your office at work, and in your classroom, and in your neighborhood, and in your home. As John 4:23 says, "The Father is seeking such people to worship him."

At the beginning of Matthew, we still have a "come-see" pattern. But at the end the pattern is "go-tell." The magi came and saw. We are to go and tell.

But what is not different is the purpose and power of God in the ingathering of the nations to worship his Son. The magnifying of Christ in the white-hot worship of all nations is the reason the world exists.

From the Elders

Dear Ones,

As shared with you several days ago, the elders met on Monday night to, among other things, discuss what we believe is the wisest, most appropriate way to conduct our congregational services in light of the strong uptick in the coronavirus and the risk that poses to us all.

After evaluation and prayer to the Father for guidance, here is what we have determined:

- For the remainder of December our worship will be led fully by Domingo via online streaming from his home, as it was last Sunday, to effect minimal physical contact. There will be no worship service at the building.
- We hope by early January we will feel okay with again moving back to online streaming from the building with Domingo being joined by other worship leaders (singing, prayer, communion, et al) but with no one else in the building. In other words, everyone else will be worshipping with us remotely.
- Depending upon the activity of the virus and hoped for help from the vaccination process, we will then move back to a mode of having 30 or more of us joining in the worship at the building (like we were doing before the most recent "spike.") in well-disciplined safety mode as soon as it is deemed to be safe. We pray that will be soon, but let's not prejudge that.
- Sometime thereafter--again, in paraphrase, "Lord make it quickly"-- we will re-achieve <u>full</u>, in person fellowship....and a glorious thing it will be.

In the meantime, we urge you to continue in full <u>everyday</u> worship to God from wherever you are....and, on Sunday via on-line streaming with the full Greenbank body of believers.

Participate in the Wednesday evening and other Bible studies. They will strengthen you.

Pray for an end to this pandemic. Pray for one another. Pray for the nation. And, yes, pray for all of the people of the world...for the whole of His creation.

Love Him and love one another.
