One Life Becomes Many by Mark Finn

THE CROSS is not a place you go to enthusiastically. Jesus didn't. He sought another way. He wrestled with it in the Garden of Gethsemane. But he loved and trusted his heavenly Father. And he especially loved us, and so he was willing to go. A sacrifice isn't just offhandedly throwing something away. It is the giving up of something precious, valued, in order to bring about a much greater good.

If all you've even known has been ease and a charmed life, the cross won't make a lot of sense. But if you've suffered, really suffered, or through a compassionate heart felt the suffering of someone else, maybe someone very close to you – the cross makes sense. It even draws you to it. Here is God, not observing our sufferings, but *in* our sufferings. No matter what we've gone through or will go through, we can confidently say, "Dear Lord, you know what it's like. You've been there. You understand." You're right; he does.

While Jesus' disciples were whistling along, clueless about the salvation of the world, Jesus knew fully what was ahead. With the enormity of this task looming before him, he once more tried to get through to them, saying, "Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds" (John 12:24).

There is a principle here that for new life to come, something must die. When that happens, it is not a negation but a multiplication. The cross was planted, and from Christ giving up his life, came many seeds. To this day we are seeing the results. In calling us to take up our cross, he extended this principle to all of us. We don't die on a wooden cross, but we must die to an old selfish way of living, an old way of being self-centered rather than God centered and others centered. A part of us dies, so that Christ can live in us. Paul said, "I have been crucified with Christ." When that happens, blessings multiply and in Jesus' words, "produce many seeds." Your life wasn't meant to add up to just one, but many.

If Satan can just keep us plugged into ourselves, becoming a self-referential loop focused on our own preferences, comforts, complaints, and gripes, he's won. But if we plug into this cross, into this Christ-focus that leads us to serve others – our life produces many seeds. It branches out, blesses, unburdens – and as Christ gets our focus off ourselves – of all things – we find deep joy. This is what Jesus means when he said, "If you lose your life, you will find it."
