Years ago, I recall my dad express his admiration for a deacon who was extremely effective in handling benevolence requests.

Or a bible class teacher who makes the Bible come alive and makes practical application of Scripture to everyday living.

I knew a sister in Christ whose gift was cheering hurting hearts by bringing homemade soup and bread, delivered with a smile.

"As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God" (1 Peter 4:10 NASB).

First, we must discover our gifts. Is it leading, teaching, encouraging, or some other strength?

Second, we must acknowledge God as the source of our gifts. We certainly didn't generate them, nor did they just happen.

Third, we must use our gifts to serve others. That's when we become "good stewards of the manifold grace of God."

Our gifts have one source: God. But our gifts have at least two purposes. 1) Our gifts are for serving one another, and 2) "so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to him belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (1 Peter 4:10-11).

From God and back to God. He gives the gift; we use the gift. Others are blessed; God gets the glory.
