

Life in Proper Perspective by Orpheus Heyward

My devotion this morning was James 4:14-15, which approaches the brevity of life. James describes life to his audience as a "vapor." To accent the nature of that "vapor," he states that it appears for a little while, and then vanishes away. All around us are reminders of the brevity of life. James writes in a contextual framework of encouraging unity among believers and developing intimacy with God. This section has a loose connection to the previous context yet accents the idea that your existence is temporary and without longevity.

James echoes the voices of the O.T. sacred texts. They state:

"Psalm 39:5 (NASB95) "Behold, You have made my days as handbreadths, And my lifetime as nothing in Your sight; Surely every man at his best is a mere breath. Selah."

Psalm 144:4 (NASB95) "Man is like a mere breath; His days are like a passing shadow."

Determine this day what you will do with your vapor. The privilege of a tomorrow rests in the hands of a sovereign God. As you move in this life, respect that time cannot be saved or stored. It can only be spent. It is incumbent upon you to spend wisely.

Vapor Focus

1) Invest in your Intimacy with God. Your relationship with him is the only thing with eternal consequence.

2) Serve God with the unique gift he placed in your possession. Your potential to make an impact is connected to your becoming aware of what God has placed inside you.

3) Shape your life after righteousness while depending on God's grace. Live right without becoming arrogant about right living. His grace still carries you.

4) Fly high enough so you cannot hear chickens cluck. Focus on the height to which God wants you to fly and you will be less distracted by those who seek to clip your wings.

5) Every day, pause to thank God you are not where you started. Don't be so focused on the destination that you do not celebrate how far you have traveled.

6) Serve people from a posture of genuine love. Be clear about your "Why".

7) Fail Forward. Learn and grow. It is a tragedy for you to drown in what God has forgiven.

8) Engage in consistent self-evaluation. You can't win a race focused on other runners. Learn that your greatest opponent is yourself.

9) Spread the gospel of Jesus Christ so that people in your life's reach can come into salvation. They need the same good news you received.

10) Seek God's affirmation. It is all that matters. Your approval ratings will always fluctuate among people. Jesus was perfect, celebrated when he entered Jerusalem on Sunday, and was killed by Friday.
