Food Pantry Report for September

We provided food for 224 families comprised of 861 individuals. Seventy-five of these families were first time visitors, or folks that have not come since before the shutdown in 2020. The Food Bank of Delaware provided us with 9,668 lbs. of food the cost of which was covered by a grant (a value of \$6,089). We collected 13,541 lbs. of food from 9 grocery stores in the Sister Share program. We had 18 volunteers from Greenbank, 14 from Autism Delaware, and six from the community. We thank the Lord for His continued blessings.
