An Ounce of Prevention – by Joe Slater

In an effort to boost sales, a particular aftermarket filter manufacturer aired television advertisements featuring a mechanic repairing a vehicle that had neglected regular oil and filter changes. The mechanic's catchphrase was, "Pay me now, or pay me later." Spending a few dollars on oil and a filter today could potentially save you thousands of dollars in the future when faced with rebuilding a worn-out engine.

Your doctor advises you to maintain good health and prevent diseases by consuming a healthy diet, getting sufficient rest, and engaging in regular exercise. Similar to automobiles, the concept of prevention is far more effective and less burdensome than treatment.

This principle extends to spiritual matters as well. Learning and adhering to God's word today can prevent countless future disasters. It's no surprise that the wise King Solomon encouraged, "Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth" (Ecclesiastes 12:1). Waiting until a mess has been made and then attempting to clean it up may prove to be challenging and painful.

Consider how many marriages have crumbled and families have been torn apart because those involved were unfamiliar with God's word or chose not to follow it. A little preventative maintenance might have averted serious issues, but once the damage is done, it's often too late. Regretful phrases like "If only someone had taught me!: or "If only I has listened!" become all too common.

Eli, the high priest of Israel, failed to exercise that ounce of prevention by neglecting to restrain his ungodly sons (1 Samuel 3:14). Their misconduct corrupted the worship of God and led to immoral relations with a woman who served at the Tabernacle. By the time Eli finally objected to their vile behavior, his sons simply disregarded him (1 Samuel 2:23-25). Their sins resulted in their own deaths, Israel's defeat, the capture of the Ark of the Covenant by the Philistines, and Eli's own demise.

It is crucial to trust and obey God's word now. Teach everyone you can to do the same. Indeed, an ounce of prevention is truly worth a pound of cure.
