How's Our Vision? – edited from a post by Trent Thrasher

Many people in Jesus' day cried out for Him to cure their physical blindness. And Jesus, being gracious, restored their sight (Matthew 9:27-31, 20:30-34; Mark 10:46-52). But worse than physical blindness is spiritual blindness - not seeing past the material to the eternal. The Pharisees struggled with this (Matthew 15:12-14). Without diligence, any follower of Christ risks becoming spiritually near-sighted.

When our faith lacks virtue, knowledge, self-control, endurance, godliness, kindness, and love, we become blind (2 Peter 1:5-9). Lacking these, we lose sight of spiritual things; the temporal world consumes our vision. But as Christians, we need to set our minds on heavenly things and focus less on the earthly (Colossians 3:2). We walk by faith in the unseen God, not physical sight (2 Corinthians 5:7). His word guides our paths (Psalm 119:105), not our faulty vision (Jeremiah 10:23).

To have clear spiritual vision, the old sinful self must die daily (Luke 9:23). We must vigilantly guard against worldliness or near-sightedness. With our eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). Let us run with endurance, refusing distraction (Hebrews 12:1-2). Press on toward the goal, letting nothing blur your heavenly vision (Philippians 3:14).

Brothers and sisters, we serve an invisible God, and our lives must reflect that higher vision. Don't lose sight of the eternal amidst the temporal. With the eye of faith, look beyond earthly troubles to the unseen reality of God's presence and coming glory. Stay focused on Christ - He alone brings our purpose into perfect vision.
