

Jesus' Simple Instruction that Led to a 4-Million Percent Growth of Christianity By Kyle Winkler (edited)

Jesus' ministry challenged the religious culture of His day. He healed on the Sabbath, spoke to women publicly, and associated with Samaritans—acts considered taboo. But in doing so, He revealed the true character of God and dismantled flawed traditions.

One of His most radical teachings came during the Sermon on the Mount: "You have heard the law that says, 'Love your neighbor' and hate your enemy" (Matt. 5:43). "Neighbor" meant someone like you. "Enemy" referred to those who were different—religiously, politically, or personally.

Jesus corrected this mindset: "But I say, love your enemies" (Matt. 5:44). That command meant loving those who don't look, act, believe, or agree with you—even those who oppose you.

Early Christians took this to heart. In the first 300 years of the Church, "love your enemies" was quoted 26 times by 10 different authors—making it the most cited verse of that era. From just 120 followers, the Church grew to 40,000 in seven years, and over five million by 300 A.D.—a 4-million percent increase.

Why? Their love for those who were different. They didn't have a choice—everyone else was different. And they chose to love anyway.

If revival is what we long for, maybe it begins here. Today, our "enemies" may go by different names— Muslim, atheist, liberal, conservative, immigrant, gay, Black, White—but Jesus' command remains: love those who are different than you. That kind of love may just be the key to the next great awakening.
